Meeting called to order: 7:20 pm

Minutes were approved with corrections made. The Agenda was reviewed and items added by Board members.

Treasurer's Report: Current balance is \$1304.^{3.61}~~11~~. We have 43 members.

Community Custody Detail Program: With Board input, Gordon has notified the City that we would like to have parts of Silver Hill Neighborhood cleaned periodically. This will include Gold Avenue, cross streets Sycamore to Yale and all alleyways in the neighborhood.

Keep Albuquerque Beautiful application: The Board did not identify any needs appropriate to the KAB grant this year. We will not submit an application; Katy will include the application with the notes in case we change our mind.

Historic Overlay Zone: The LUCC meeting was moved from 2/10/10 to 2/24/10. Written comments should be made to Maryellen Hennessy. Gordon will send a letter of support on behalf of the Board for the record. A good turnout on our part is necessary.

Roosevelt Park: Katy reported on activity by the Parks Department to help keep the Park safe and attractive (3 heavily graffiti'd picnic tables have been removed, repair of stone wall on east side is scheduled, tree pruning and dead tree removal are scheduled, removal of shoes from power lines in the Park has been called in to PNM).

North/South Cross Streets Master Plan: A public meeting will be held April 12 (in lieu of a Board meeting), 7:00 pm for MRW to present the Master Plan to those interested. Katy will contact Tom about doing a flyer for distribution.

Bike Boulevard on University: Gordon will clarify with Cara Sher Rosenfeld in Ike Benton's office that we approve *if* we get a few trees in the median in lieu of signage.

Alliance for Historic Landscape Preservation: Elizabeth has submitted the application for Silver Hill to present with MRW in a session about "works in progress". We'll know by March 5, 2010 if our application was accepted. (see attached)

Board Training: Gordon will talk to Don Hancock about being our trainer. Suggested dates for the training are a 3rd or 4th Monday evening.

CNM buildings at Coal and Buena Vista: The Board has been waiting for feedback re: 1) the feasibility of historic preservation and 2) preference of nearby neighbors. Lacking that information for several months now, the Board recommends that Gordon notify CNM that we are in favor of a park, patrolled and maintained by CNM.
